Village News – The Archstone Foundation of Long Beach recently funded a grant to understand the viability of a California Village Coalition to help build greater public awareness of the positive impact Village membership is having for older Californians. Lisa Brinkmann, Ginni Saunders (Novato Village) and Sue Steele (Mill Valley Village) participated at a regional meeting to explore how the 60+ Villages in California may benefit from a statewide coalition and where we fit into the larger landscape of aging services in California.

While participating in the state and regional coalitions, we continue to focus on strengthening our 'Village' community within Marin. Last year we launched Novato Village and expanded into San Rafael. We are now working with interested members of the community to develop the Rainbow Village, serving

older adults in the LGBT community, and widening our footprint in Corte Madera/Larkspur with an evolving Twin Cities (Ross Valley) Village. We recently made a presentation to the Fairfax Town Council in an effort to increase awareness of our services and recruit interested volunteers.
